## **DOCUMENTATION INSTRUCTIONS**

### **PLANT PROTECTION IMPORT PERMIT**

To request a Plant Protection Import Permit, visit the My CFIA link <http://inspection.gc.ca/mycfia> and sign up for a My CFIA account today.

A Plant Protection Import Permit will not be issued for a shipment once it has left the country of origin.

## **CONDITIONS OF IMPORT**

- Prior to the CFIA Import Service Centre or an inspector releasing the shipment, it must be inspected at the first place / port of entry to ensure that the species of snail being imported is / are the one(s) named on the client's import permit. If necessary, samples of the snails may be taken and submitted to the laboratory for positive identification.

-Genus and species must be listed on the required documents.

- Labelling must be in French and English for prepackaged products sold at retail.
- United States "Nutrition Facts" information is not permitted; label claims must comply with the Regulations.

## **ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS**

\*\*\* Please note that border lookouts and targets take precedence over import requirements indicated in AIRS.

- Any import inspection services provided by CFIA staff are subject to a CFIA user fee.
- May be subject to requirements of Other Government Departments (federal, provincial, territorial or municipal).
- Contact an Import Service Centre for further information.

Submissions of 'Request for Documentation Review' form (CFIA/ACIA 5272):

\*\*Please note that there are specific instructions depending on method of declaration:

- Paper Declaration: 'Request for Documentation Review' form (CFIA/ACIA 5272) must be completed when providing a faxed package to the NISC.
- Integrated Import Declaration (IID): 'Request for Documentation Review' form (CFIA/ACIA 5272) is only to be provided as part of the declaration if required by AIRS, under the Documentation and Registration Requirements section of AIRS.

\*\*\* GUIDELINES TO FOLLOW WHEN SUBMITTING A FAXED PACKAGE TO NISC: \*\*\*

- Do not use company fax cover page
- Use the 'Request for Documentation Review' form (CFIA/ACIA 5272) as the first document of a fax submission.
- Ensure the new version of the 'Request for Documentation Review' form (CFIA/ACIA 5272) is used.
- Ensure all information on the 'Request for Documentation Review' form (CFIA/ACIA 5272) is typed.
- Do not provide a bar code and/or a label transaction code on the form CFIA/ACIA 5272.
- Ensure to key in the transaction number on the form CFIA/ACIA 5272.
- Do not affix any labels or stickers to the form CFIA/ACIA 5272.
- Should a single fax contain multiple requests ensure the 'Request for Documentation Review' form CFIA/ACIA 5272 separates each request.

WOOD PACKAGING MATERIAL (for all origins except continental United States)

Brokers/ Importers must attest to one of the following with respect to the packaging material being used to ship the product:

- "Wood packaging contained with shipment displays the ISPM No. 15 compliant stamp."

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR CBSA

D-19 - Fish and Fish Products : Included in This Section:

- Fish and fish products imported for human consumption, including live fish imported for direct human consumption.

The Safe Food for Canadians Regulations define "fish" to include "shellfish, crustaceans and other marine animals, and any of their parts, products and by-products."

Excluded From This Section:

- Imported live fish not for human consumption including but not limited to fish imported for further cultivation in aquaculture operations, bait, and ornamental fish. Please note that live fish are not considered to be imported for further cultivation in aquaculture operations when they are imported for inventory control and held live prior to marketing for human consumption. These may be subject to regulations enforced by Department of Fisheries and Oceans or provincial authorities.
- Other imported fish products not for human consumption including but not limited to frozen fish labeled as bait, stuffed fish for display purposes (including puffer fish), fish imported for pet food and fish imported for analytical purposes.

Notes

- The requirements of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Fauna and Wild Flora (CITES) are not provided in the Memorandum. Refer to Memorandum D19-7-1 for further information and to ensure that restrictions do not apply.
- The requirements of the Fish Health Protections Regulations made under the Fisheries Act and enforced by the Department of Fisheries and Oceans are not provided in this Memorandum.
